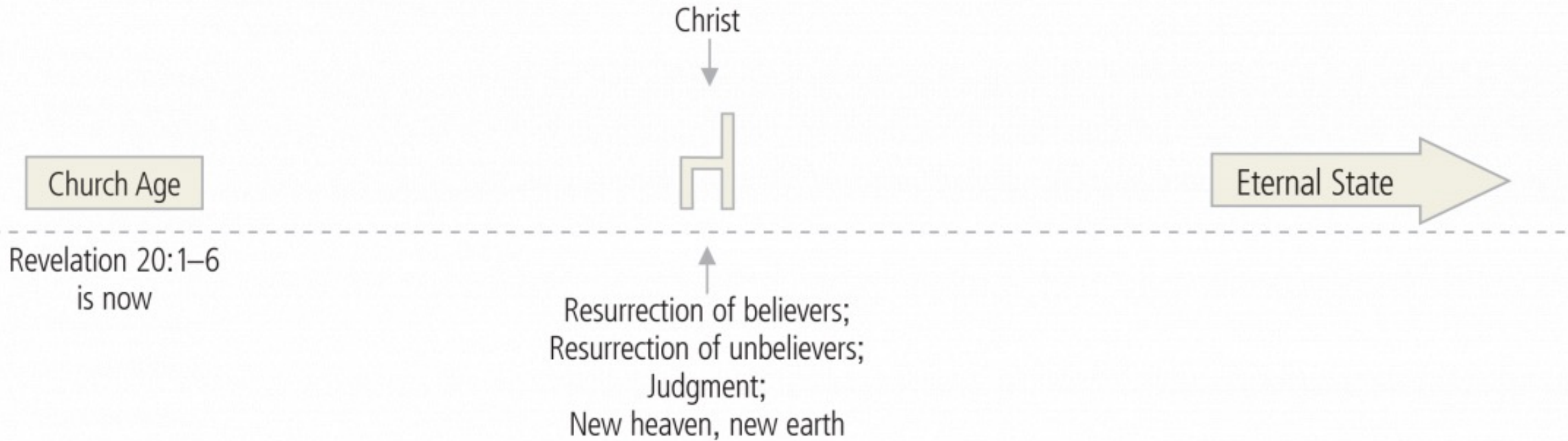

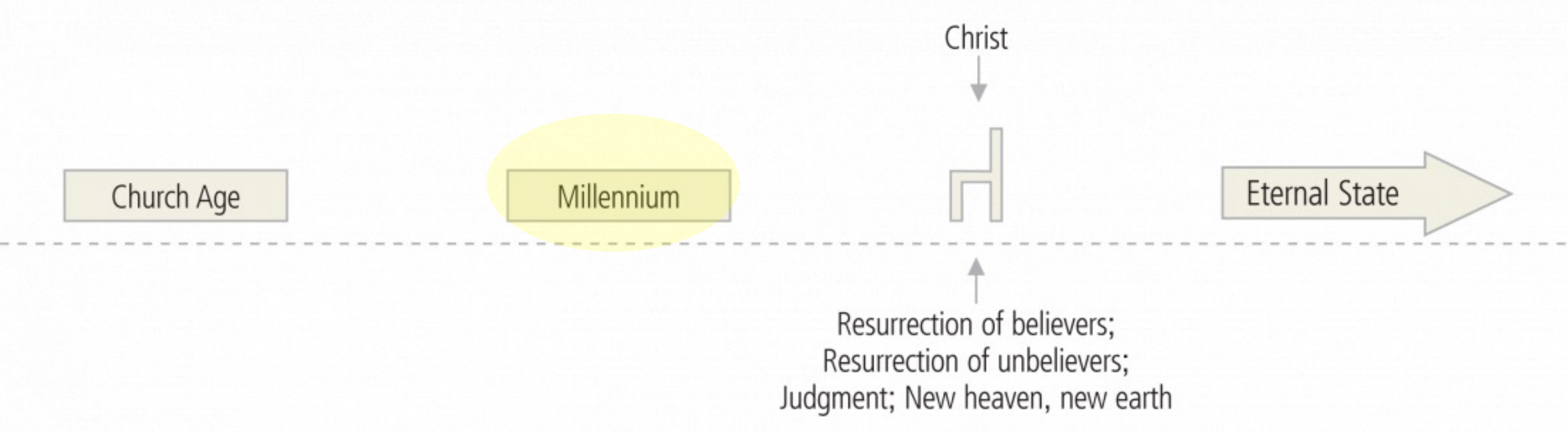

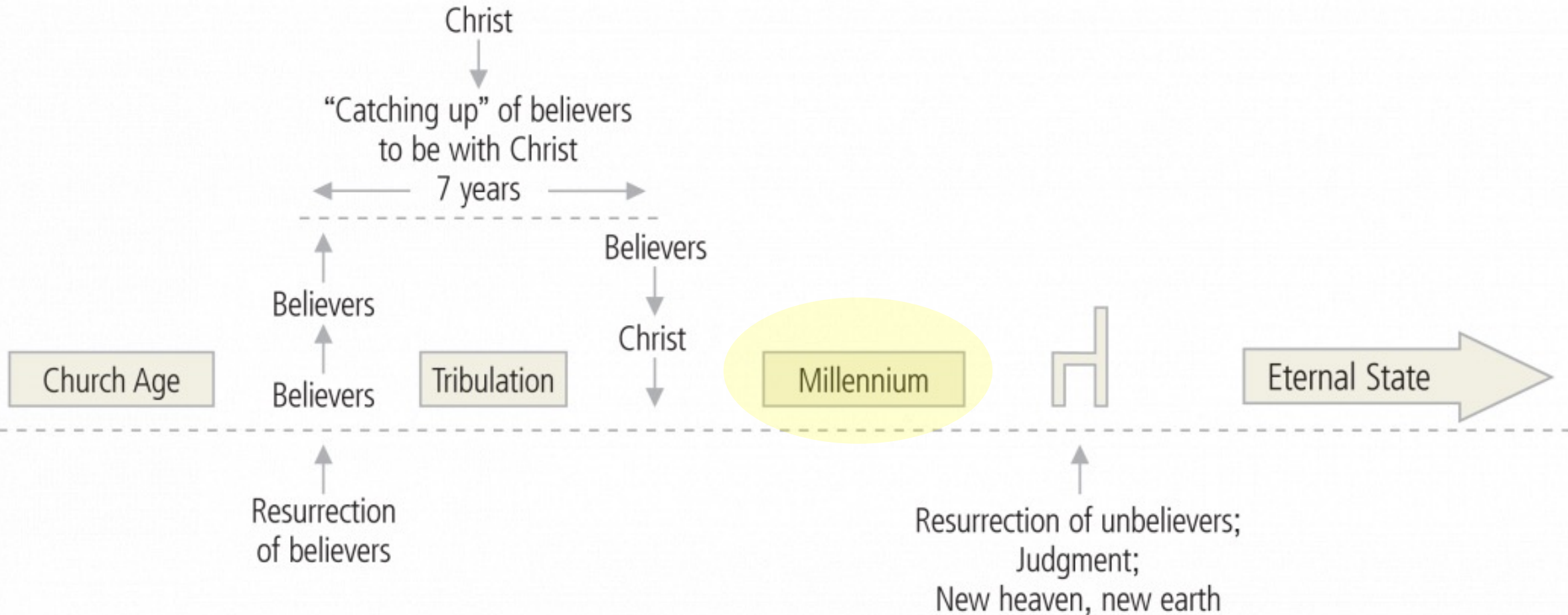

⁹ For **God has not destined us for wrath**, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ,

2 Thessalonians 2:6–7 (ESV)

⁶ And you know what is restraining him now so that he may be revealed in his time. ⁷ For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work. Only he who now restrains it will do so until he is out of the way.

2 Thessalonians 2:3–4 (ESV)

For that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and **the man of lawlessness is revealed**, the son of destruction, 4 who opposes and exalts himself against every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming himself to be God.

- It assures us of God's victory
- It assures us that the world is not out of control
- It assures us that God knows the future
- It assures us of life after death

Why do the various views matter?

- They form our expectations and can shape our behavior

How should the church relate to our world?

Ex: Postmillennialist's who believe the church will grow and grow until the world is transformed emphasize transformation of culture

Ex. Pretribulational Premillennialists who believe in a future 1000 year Millennium emphasize supporting national Israel.
