Eschatology and Hope

Hope

Definition: a feeling of expectation and desire for a certain thing to happen

A or D: Hope is a psychological necessity? (Why?)

Did you know that many secular thinkers in the ancient world did not regard hope as a virtue, but merely as a temporary illusion?

Look up **Ephesians 2:12** and **1 Thessalonians 4:13** – **What would you say is missing in the lives of these folks with no hope?**

Why is belief in a living God essential for long lasting hope?

- A living God acts and intervenes in human life
- He can be trusted to implement his promises

If there is no living God, where does one go to find hope? How might that look in our world today?

Biblical hope, though, is not a matter of temperament, nor is it on based on the condition of prevailing circumstances or human possibilities. It does not depend upon what a man possesses, or what he may be able to do for himself, or what another human being may be able to do for him. It becomes an "anchor of the soul" as described in Hebrews 6:19.

Look at Romans 4:18 – What do you think this verse is getting at? (May need to read further 19-21)

"His faith flew in the face of that hope which is founded on the evidence of reason and common sense — 'hope' as we often use the word ('I hope to win the lottery"). Yet is faith was firmly based on the hope that springs from the promise of God. We note here that Abraham's faith is not described as a 'leap into the dark,'... but as a 'leap' from the evidences of his senses into the security of God's word and promise." — Douglas Moo, Romans, pgs. 282-283

From this passage, how are hope and faith related? (They are inseparable...)

When we talk about faith and hope, what other word in Scripture often finds itself with these two words? (Love)

How do these three words relate to our topic of Eschatology?

It is interesting that "there are no explicit references to hope in the teaching of Jesus. He teaches his disciples, however, not to be anxious about the future, because that future is in the hands of a loving Father. He also leads them to expect that after his resurrection renewed spiritual power will be available for them, enabling them to do even greater works than he did, to overcome sin and death, and to look forward to sharing his own eternal glory."
