

July 2024 Bible Reading Plan

Job – is perhaps the earliest book of the Bible and is set in the period of the patriarchs (Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph). It tells the story of a man who loses everything and wrestles with the question, Why? Job will also wrestle with the sovereignty of God and what it means to trust God in the midst of difficult circumstances.

Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon are three of four letters (Ephesians being the other) that the apostle Paul wrote from prison. Here we read of a man who longs to see individual believers and young churches growing in faith and understanding, rooted in Christ, and seeing that faith worked out in everyday life.
